Thank you for your interest in Glossopdale School & Sixth Form; your local, thriving Post-16 provision.

We teach a wide range of academic and vocational courses, with excellent facilities in a state of the art, dedicated Sixth Form Centre. Courses cover both 'A' Level and Level 3 vocational options and will be tailored to suit your needs: they can be academic, vocational or a combination of both. We also ensure that students have the opportunity to build an array of qualifications outside the usual subject range, such as The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), Duke of Edinburgh Award and a Personal Development curriculum that supports decision-making in your chosen future pathway.

The teaching staff at Glossopdale Sixth Form are experienced and passionate subject specialists, dedicated to working with you and giving you the precise support needed to succeed. Pastoral care is excellent, with a Head of Sixth Form, Year Manager and a tutor team to guide you, in and out of the classroom. Tailored Enrichment

Life in the Sixth Form is about more than just lessons. You will take part in a wide range of enrichment opportunities designed to build your confidence and strengthen your university or job applications. From volunteering and mentoring younger students, to joining leadership programmes and student committees, you will find activities that help you stand out.

Stretch & Challenge

For those aiming high we offer an extensive programme to stretch and challenge our most able students. This includes support for Oxbridge and university applications, guidance on personal statements for competitive courses, super-curricular opportunities and a network of alumni who can share their own university and career experiences.



Your Study Pathways

At Glossopdale Sixth Form, we know that no two students are the same. That's why we offer three distinct pathways — allowing you to choose the route that matches your strengths, ambitions and future goals.

Pathway 1 – A Levels

A Levels remain the traditional route into university. You will study three or four subjects across two years, with final examinations at the end of Year 13. Alongside your subjects, you can also take the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), which develops independent research and critical thinking skills. This pathway is particularly suited to students who enjoy academic study and may be considering applications to university, degree apprenticeships, medicine, law, or other competitive courses.

Pathway 2 – Mixed A Level & Vocational

This option combines the academic challenge of A Levels with the practical, coursework-based approach of vocational courses. You will typically study three subjects over two years, assessed through a mixture of exams and coursework. This pathway is ideal for students who want the best of both worlds: developing higher-level academic skills while also gaining valuable vocational experience relevant to future careers. Students on this pathway may still be considering university post-18.

Pathway 3 – Vocational

Vocational qualifications are designed for students who prefer applied learning and want to link their studies directly to careers. You will usually choose three Extended Certificates (equivalent to an A Level each), in subjects such as Health & Social Care, Sport, Criminology, Engineering or Creative Media. Lessons are a blend of practical projects and theory, with assessment through coursework, presentations and external examinations. This pathway provides a strong foundation for progression into higher education or directly into employment.



Other Opportunities

Whichever pathway you choose, you'll also benefit from a range of additional qualifications and experiences. These include the EPQ, Duke of Edinburgh Award, Sports Leadership, First Aid and other short courses that help you build a stand-out CV. For those who need to secure a grade 4 in English or Maths, we also offer GCSE resit opportunities alongside your main programme of study.

We offer a wide range of subjects to match your interests, abilities and career aspirations. Whether you prefer academic study, practical learning or a mixture of both, you'll find the right combination here at Glossopdale Sixth Form.

Support for Every Student

SEND Support

Students with additional needs are supported by our experienced SEND team. We ensure that the right adjustments are in place so you can fully access your studies and the wider Sixth Form experience. Support may include:

- Specialist advice and mentoring.
- Extra time or adjustments in exams.
- Access to Learning Support Assistants.
- Regular reviews to make sure the right strategies are in place.

Our approach is personal and flexible — we work closely with you, your family, and your teachers to remove barriers and maximise your potential.

Financial Support

We want Sixth Form to be accessible to all, regardless of financial background. Our 16–19 Bursary Fund provides help with travel, equipment, textbooks and other essential costs. Support may include:

- Vulnerable Bursary (for students in care, care leavers, or those receiving specific benefits).
- Discretionary Bursary (based on household income).
- In-kind support such as equipment, travel passes or IT access.

Full details and application forms are available on our website, and staff are on hand to help families through the process.

Students From Other Schools

We welcome applications from students who are joining us from other schools or who have been home educated. Our induction programme ensures that everyone settles quickly, makes new friends, and feels part of the Sixth Form community. Staff and students alike are committed to making new starters feel at home.

Our New Building

Enrichment & Leadership

Every student takes part in at least one hour of enrichment each week. This is your chance to explore new interests, develop valuable skills, and give something back to the community. Opportunities include:

- Volunteering in the local community or supporting younger students in school.
- Joining the Student Leadership Team.
- Leading clubs and activities in sport, drama, music or art.
- Taking part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award or Sports Leadership qualifications.

Trips, Visits & Guest Speakers

Throughout the year you'll take part in a range of experiences designed to broaden your horizons. These include university visits, subject-specific trips, cultural and careers visits, as well as talks from guest speakers who are leaders in their fields.

Work Experience

Every Year 12 student completes a week of work experience. Placements are carefully chosen to link with your future pathway, giving you the chance to develop practical skills, build networks and gain valuable insights into the world of work. For some courses, weekly industry placements are available to give you even deeper experience in your chosen sector.

Careers & Progression

We place a strong emphasis on preparing you for life after Sixth Form. Our careers programme includes one-to-one advice, application workshops, CV writing, and interview preparation. We also have excellent links with local employers, apprenticeship providers and universities, ensuring you are well-informed about all the routes available to you.

Oxbridge & University Support

Students aiming for the most competitive universities benefit from a bespoke programme that includes:

- Workshops on preparing for early entry courses such as Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science.
- One-to-one guidance on writing personal statements for highly competitive degrees.
- Mock interview practice with staff and visiting professionals.
- Oxbridge outreach events and links with admissions tutors.

Super-Curricular Opportunities

We encourage you to go beyond your subjects and develop the skills that top universities and employers are looking for. Opportunities include:

- Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).
- Super-curricular reading programmes.
- Online courses and MOOCs.
- Student-led research and presentations.
- Specialist subject competitions.

Alumni Network

Our growing network of alumni is a real source of inspiration. Past students have gone on to study at Cambridge, Russell Group universities and beyond, as well as secure competitive apprenticeships. You will also have the chance to visit universities, take part in taster days, and benefit from established partnerships with higher education providers. These experiences help you feel confident about your next steps and make informed decisions about your future.



Entry Criteria

Our entry criteria are 5 grades 9–4 in separate GCSE subjects or an equivalent Merit or above in Level 2 BTEC subjects, with a grade 9–4 in English and Maths.

Some subjects have their own entry recommendations; please refer to the course directory for individual subject areas for this information. This entry requirement is ambitious and reflects the fact that A Level courses are challenging. However, we look at each application on a case-by-case basis and aim to be as flexible as we can when making our conditional offers. Some students, for example, may be strong in some areas and less strong in others; their A Level subject choices may reflect these strengths even if the overall entry criteria have not been fully met across five GCSE subjects. Our primary concern when making any offer is to ensure that every student is enrolled on courses that allow them to succeed and to access their future pathways.

How to Apply



Applications & Offers

We welcome applications from any student who would like to join our Sixth Form from other establishments. Students from other schools settle in well and are quickly made to feel part of our Sixth Form community, and students from Glossopdale welcome the opportunity to make new friends and forge new relationships.

The initial deadline for applications is usually by Christmas, but we accept applications right up to our September enrolment. All students who apply will be given a consultation meeting to discuss their course choices and ensure they are making the right decisions about their future pathway. All initial offers are subject to summer GCSE and BTEC results.
