## HIGH STANDARDS

As members of the Sixth Form, you are role models for younger students and ambassadors for Glossopdale School and Sixth Form. We expect you to meet high standards in your behaviour, attitude, and appearance at all times. The following expectations apply both in and out of the classroom:





### **Appearance:**

Sixth Form students must dress appropriately for a school environment. Clothing must be respectful and suitable for an 11–18 setting:

- No offensive slogans or logos
- · No midriffs on show
- One nose piercing (stud only)
- No visible tattoos
- No hats or hoods to be worn inside the building

### Conduct:

As Sixth Form students, you are expected to model mature, respectful, and professional behaviour at all times. You are role models for the rest of the school, and your conduct should reflect that responsibility.

- Always treat staff, students, and visitors with respect.
- Set a positive example through your words, actions, and attitude.
- Wear your ID badge visibly at all times while on school grounds.
- Always sign in and out using the school systems.
- No food or hot drinks are allowed during lessons – only water is permitted.
- Always uphold school values and follow all Sixth Form rules and policies.

# ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

High attendance and excellent punctuality are key characteristics of students who achieve in line with or above their potential. Research shows that poor attendance has a serious negative impact on outcomes. Attendance below 95% is linked to an average drop of one A level grade per subject, rising to two grades when attendance falls below 90%.

As part of their contract of attendance:

- All Sixth Form students are expected to maintain a minimum attendance rate of 95% or above to ensure strong progress.
- Students must attend all timetabled lessons and one hour of Personal Development each week.
- Students must take part in one hour of Enrichment per week.
- When on site and not in lessons, students are expected to use their time productively.
- Students will stay in college and attend 'College Study' for one hour per week, per subject. This will relax by Christmas provided that we are happy with their approach to independent work.
- Punctuality is essential. Students must arrive on time to all sessions. Persistent lateness disrupts learning and may result in sanctions.

### Please note;

Failure to meet attendance and punctuality expectations will be addressed through a staged support process:

- 1. Informal meeting with the Sixth Form Learning Manager to set targets and offer support.
- 2. Formal meeting with the Head of Sixth Form and Learning Manager if there is no improvement a warning and written targets will be issued.
- 3. A formal meeting with the Assistant Headteacher: Sixth Form and parents/carers present. A final warning will be given.
- 4. Continued failure to meet expectations may result in the student being asked to leave Glossopdale Sixth Form.

### **Reporting an Absence**

If you are going to be absent, you must email sixthform@glossopdaleschool.org.uk as soon as you are aware.

### Please include:

- The reason for your absence
- The date you expect to return
- Copy your parent/carer into the email

This helps us keep accurate records and ensure appropriate support is in place if needed.

# ENRICHMENT AND WIDER OPPORTUNITIES

Success in the Sixth Form isn't just about what you do in lessons — what you do beyond the classroom is equally important. Universities, apprenticeship providers and employers value students who show commitment, leadership and wider interests.

All Sixth Form students are expected to take part in at least one hour of enrichment per week. This can be through organised Sixth Form activities or approved opportunities outside school.

### Examples include:

- Volunteering in the local community
- Counselling or mentoring younger students
- Supporting with reading or Maths interventions in the main school
- Helping with clubs, activities and school events
- Participating in enrichment activities organised by the Sixth Form

In addition, part-time work can be a great way to develop workplace skills and experience. However, we strongly recommend keeping part-time work to no more than 12 hours per week, so it does not affect your academic progress.

Getting involved in enrichment and using your time well outside the classroom will help you build confidence, develop valuable skills and strengthen your applications for university, apprenticeships or employment.

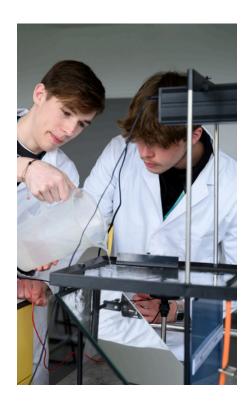


# ACADEMIC SUPPORT



Your academic progress is closely monitored and supported throughout your time in Sixth Form

- We set aspirational target grades for all students using ALPs.
  These targets are based on your GCSE results and predict
  what you could achieve in each subject if you performed in the
  top 25% of students nationally. These targets are designed to
  stretch and challenge you, and we'll support you every step of
  the way in aiming for them.
- You'll regularly record the grades you're achieving in each subject on your subject tracking sheets. These help you monitor your own progress and identify areas where more effort or support may be needed. Every half term, you'll review your tracking sheets with your Mr Peate during Student Reflection Sessions, where you'll reflect on your progress and set short-term goals.
- Each term, you'll also take part in a formal Subject Review Meeting with your teachers. This is a focused one-to-one conversation about how you're doing in each subject and what you can do to improve.
- Your teachers report your progress to the Sixth Form team three times a year. This data allows us to identify students who may need additional support. If you're not meeting your target grades in two or more subjects, you may be invited – along with your parents/carers if needed – to an Individual Action Plan (IAP) meeting with Mrs Boakes. In this meeting, you'll agree personalised targets to help you get back on track.
- Over the two years, you will receive four progress reports and have four parents' evenings, giving you and your family regular updates on your progress and next steps. You'll also have mock/trial exams and review meetings where required.





# INDEPENDENT STUDY

Independent study is essential to success at A-Level. Lessons alone aren't enough – to achieve your target grades, you need to take responsibility for your learning outside the classroom.

### **Why Independent Study Matters**

- Builds deeper understanding reviewing and applying what you've learned helps turn knowledge into long-term understanding.
- Improves exam performance regular revision and practice improve your confidence and skills under exam conditions.
- Develops vital skills time management, organisation, and selfmotivation are key for university, apprenticeships, and employment.
- Directly linked to outcomes students who commit to independent study consistently perform better at A-Level.

### What Independent Study Should Involve

You should aim to complete 5 hours per subject, per week. This can be done at home or in Sixth Form study areas. Use the time to:

- Review lesson notes and organise your folders
- Complete homework and improve previous work
- · Revise using flashcards, mind maps, or past papers
- · Complete wider reading or research tasks
- · Act on teacher feedback to improve your work
- Prepare for assessments or coursework deadlines

Independent study isn't just about doing more—it's about doing the right things, regularly. If you're unsure how to study effectively, ask your teacher for guidance. The effort you put in now will shape your results—and your future.

### **UCAS and Apprenticeship Deadlines**

All students applying to university through UCAS must submit their applications by the Sixth Form internal deadline in late October. This allows time for references to be written and final checks to be made before the national deadline in January. Students applying to Oxbridge, Medicine, Dentistry, or Veterinary Science must meet an earlier internal deadline in early October, in line with the national deadline for these courses.

For those applying for higher or degree apprenticeships, deadlines vary depending on the employer, and some opportunities open as early as October in Year 13. These applications can involve multiple stages, so early research and preparation are essential. The Sixth Form team will provide support throughout the year to help you meet deadlines and submit strong, well-prepared applications.
