


Messages for all year groups



Excellent Attendance

- We all know that the pathway to outstanding achievement starts with excellent attendance, and it was absolutely fantastic to see so many students with excellent attendance last week!
- Remember, students with 97%+ attendance have a much higher chance of achieving their target grades, so attending school every day is essential!
- We want every student to aim for excellent attendance this term 100%!





Excellent Attendance - Year 11

- Please be reminded that attendance remains compulsory for all Year 11 students, every day, until Friday 13th June.
- Students are expected to attend school every day, even on days when they are not sitting an exam.
- Lessons are continuing as normal and vital revision sessions, support, and targeted intervention are being delivered by subject teachers to prepare students for their upcoming exams.
- We are committed to supporting all students in achieving success, and daily attendance is a crucial part of that journey!
- As proven by the latest research, students with excellent attendance (97%+) are 1.9 times more likely to achieve a Grade 5 in English & Maths than students with less than 97% attendance!



Attendance Highlights

- There were 664 (73%) of our students with **excellent** attendance last week 100%! AMAZING!
- 10 tutor groups had 95%+ last week Well done!!
- In addition to that, a further 16 tutor groups had higher than 90% attendance last week! Well done!
- Well done to Year 7, the best attending year group last week!
- Well done to 10SSK, who were our best attending tutor group last week!
- Well done everyone! Can we all work together to see whole-school attendance climb even higher this week?

Why is this happening?


- You may be sharing your lunchtime with this year group in September, this way you can get into the routine of doing so

Things to Keep in Mind at Lunchtime



- The "light lunch" serving area in the conservatory is open to both Year 7 and Year 9, so feel free to use it.
- You might not always get your favourite seat—it's first come, first served, and that's totally fair. Do not ask the Y7s to vacate their seat for you.
- Please be kind and respectful to everyone—let's all help keep things friendly and positive.
- You should be the role models to the year 7s and try to be empathic and helpful towards them; they have not shared their lunchtime with another year group before.





Fire Evacuation Policy

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If the fire alarm sounds you must:

- Stop what you are doing.
- Leave the building via the nearest exit, leave your bag and belongings.
- Walk calmly, with pace and purpose to the tennis courts.
- Line up in with your tutor group in register order.
- Remain silent and follow all instructions from staff.

If you are a lift user and are on the first or second floor, go to the refuge at the stairs and follow the procedure you have been shown. The teachers have to check that all staff and students have evacuated and are safe.

Do not tamper or play with the break glass alarm systems.

Do not throw objects or mess around near fire fighting equipment or the alarm system.


Malicious behaviour will lead to serious consequences.

Alarms are tested every Tuesday before school.

There are no planned fire evacuation drills this term.







Lift Use: Students with PEEPs and temporary lift access

- Students are not allowed to use the lifts in school, unless it is part of their PEEP / risk assessment or they are accompanied by staff.
- Students do not automatically have a 'buddy' to travel with them, this is issued on a case by case situation by the HOY or YM.
- Temporary lift users in KS3 must be supervised by an adult when using the lift. Year Manager, First Aider, HOY and SLT will be able to supervise you when you need to use the lift.
- Temporary lift users in KS4, may be issued a key each day, adherence to their risk assessment and lift use policy is essential, otherwise it will be revoked.
- Students cannot travel in the lift with friends or jump in with other lift users.

CCTV is in use and malicious or unauthorised use of the lift will result in consequences.

On your exam day

This checklist will help you to be as prepared as possible for your exams, so that on the day itself you can focus on doing your best.

Before sitting your exams, ensure you know: the date, time and location of your exams you might find it helpful to write this information in a calendar or planner who to contact at school or college in case there's an emergency that makes you late or unable to sit your exam	What you cannot take into exams: any type of phone revision notes any type of watch (this includes analogue, digital and smart watches)
What you will need: a clear pencil case at least two black ink pens - blue pens are not acceptable an approved calculator for relevant exams appropriate apparatus such as a ruler or protractor for relevant exams a clear water bottle if you wish to take one in - it must not have a label	Other important information: Listen carefully to the invigilator's instructions which will be specific to your exam. If you are unsure of anything, please raise your hand and wait for the invigilator. Fill in your details on the front of your answer booklet. If you need additional answer sheets, raise your hand and wait for an invigilator whe will provide you with one. Remember to add your details to this booklet too. If you heed to use the tollet or feel unwell, raise your hand and wait for an invigilator who will escort you from the exam room.
Contingency sessions: There are contingency sessions within the Summer 2024 axim timetable – the afternoon of 6 June and 13 June 2024, and the morning and afternoon of 26 June 2024. Make sure you are available on all three dates even if you do not have an exam.	If you have any questions about your exams, please ask your teacher or exams officer.




Information for candidates Using social media and examinations/assessments

While we like to share our experiences online, when it comes to exams, we have to be careful.

- Sharing ideas online can be helpful when you're studying or revising
- However, sharing certain information (see information on the right) can break the rules and could affect your results
- If you're not sure what you can and can't discuss online, check with your teacher
- If you receive exam content on social media, you must tell your teacher
- Don't be caught out by scammers selling fake exam papers







All students will receive a copy of the JCQ Information for candidates

- Students must arrive with their own pens, pencil, ruler, rubber, calculator.
- Equipment must be in a see-through pencil case or plastic bag.
- Water in a clear bottle is permitted, any label must be removed.
- Calculator case covers should be placed on the floor beside the desk.
- Mobile phones must be turned off and left in bags. *
- Watches (smart or otherwise) can not be worn, they should be left in bags too.
- Once in the exam room students must not communicate with other students.
- Students must not leave the exam room unaccompanied.

Invigilators are there to make sure the regulations are adhered to, their instructions must be followed. Invigilators are also there to help students. Students should raise their hand if they need anything, or if they realise they are still wearing their watch or their phone is still in their pocket.
