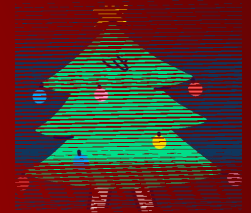
High School Musical

AFRICAN ADVENTURES

JAMBO!

After two years in the planning, students who have been fundraising for the 'African Adventure' finally left for Kenya on Sunday 27th October. 107 students (aged from 12 - 18) and 12 staff arrived in Africa for our first volunteering experience, 7000 miles from home and for some students, their first air travel or leaving home without parents/carers!

Linked with six schools across the city of Nakuru, our students and staff formed bonds and made valuable contributions to improve the educational experience for the children attending. We made tables and chairs, painted walls and murals, laid floors, dug trenches, played and taught sports and games, did painting, colouring and much much more in this incredibly humbling journey.

We visited the homes of the children from the school and our students were both empathic and emotional as they compared the conditions of poverty with their own lives. Also on the eight day trip were some Kenyan cultural experiences and sightseeing. But, the central objective was to introduce our students to a culture and existence far-removed from their own, and to form links with the people of Nakuru which we hope will be the start of a very long partnership.

Many of the students described the trip as 'life-altering' at the time and on their return have memories that are both heartwarming and heartbreaking to recall. We look forward to launching the next, 2026, 'African Adventure' opportunity early next year.

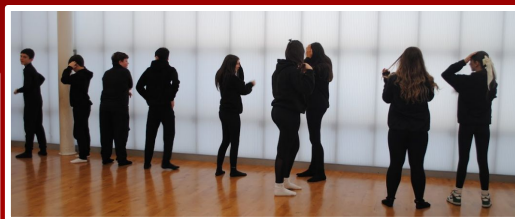

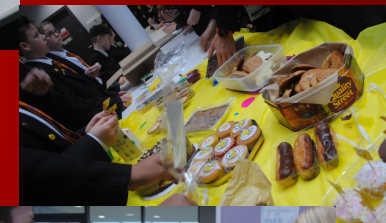

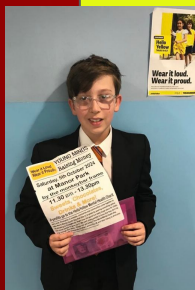


Hello Yellow

Christmas |

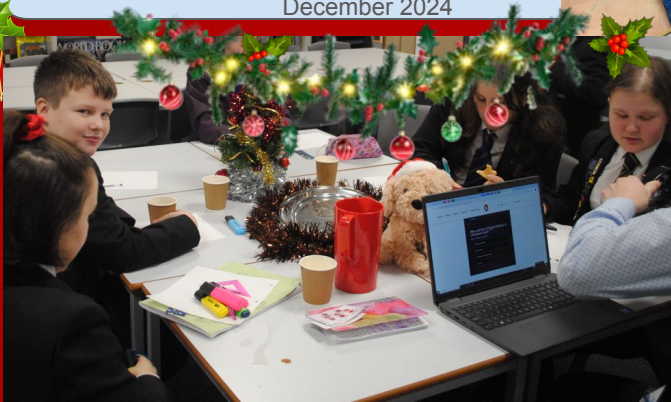

words and successfully passing **354 quizzes**. Well done, Year 7!



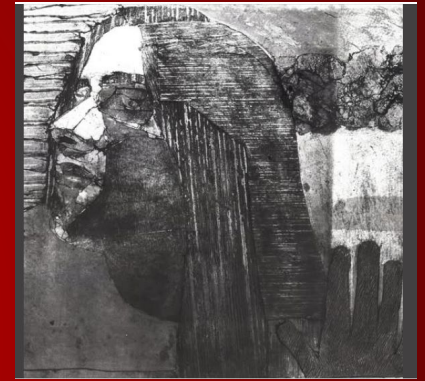
